

PIMS - CNRS INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH LAB

The PIMS - CNRS International Research Lab (IRL) has been championing the mutual exchange of knowledge since 2007. It builds and fosters collaboration in the mathematical sciences between Western Canada and France. The IRL spans across all PIMS member universities in British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Washington (USA).

- 2007: The first PIMS-CNRS agreement was signed (by Ivar Ekeland, former PIMS Director) making PIMS a CNRS-UMI (Unité Mixte Internationale) with the official title of “PIMS-Europe”.
- PIMS becomes the first North American UMI in the mathematical sciences and still the only one in Western Canada.
- 2019: Agreement renewed: PIMS-CNRS International Research Lab (IRL #3069).
- PIMS is still the only IRL in Western Canada.

Distinguished French researchers (at CNRS or a French university) spend the academic year at one of PIMS member universities and participate in research activities. PIMS hosted 41 visitors since 2007.

PIMS-CNRS FELLOWSHIP

This program supports faculty at PIMS member universities for long-term visits to France fostering collaboration.

PIMS-CNRS STUDENT MOBILITY PROGRAM

PIMS CNRS Student Mobility Program is geared for senior undergraduates, graduates and postdoctoral scholars. Supports 3-6 month student exchanges between PIMS member universities and universities/eligible institutions in

France. This program began in 2018. Currently we have three students at UBC, visiting from France.

PIMS-CNRS POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIPS

This award is targeted to applicants that are French, or who have completed their PhD degree in France. We have awarded 25 PIMS - CNRS Postdoctoral scholarships since 2007.

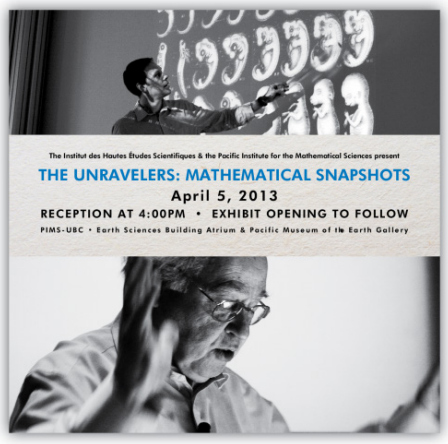


HIGH PROFILE EVENTS

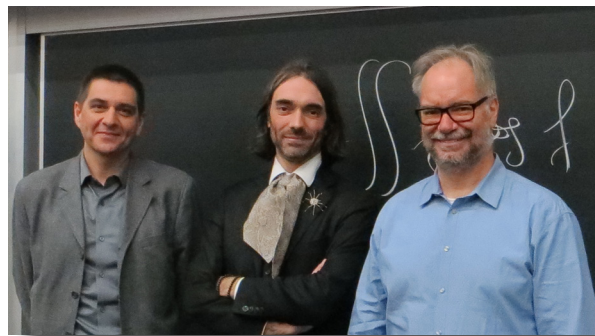
